Background

APNIEVE is a non-profit organization of individuals and institutions from the private and public sectors and is affiliated with the United Nations Educational, Social, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). The network was founded by a group of eight experts from Australia, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Russian Federation, and Thailand in March 1995 in Seoul.

Inspired by UNESCO's vision-mission of "Peace for Development and Development for Peace," APNIEVE was created "to promote and develop international education and values education for peace, human rights, democracy, and sustainable development through networking and cooperation among individuals, groups and institutions working on these fields in the Asia Pacific and the rest of the world."

The organization achieves this through the "preparation of teaching-learning materials and the training of administrators and teachers from all levels in the use of a holistic approach to education and the integration of values across the curriculum."

APNIEVE's network in the Philippines receives support from the Philippines National Commission for UNESCO, to conduct a series of teacher training workshops to enhance the competencies of teachers in values education. APNIEVE – Philippines promote inter-cultural understanding, peace, human rights and sustainable development through acquiring skills for valuing processes, building broad support for peace education, and training various groups of educators in the Philippines.

APNIEVE has a shared vision for the collaborative promotion of peace, harmony, intercultural understanding, human rights, democracy, and sustainable development. Through ranges of educational activities, personal and collective research, exploration of values and profound social issues of local and global importance, APNIEVE achieves its goal of enhancing personal, humanistic and universal values.

UNESCO celebrated the fourth International Day of Education, last January 26, 2022 under the theme . As it was detailed in UNESCO's recent global Futures of Education report, transforming the future requires an urgent rebalancing of our relationships with each other, with nature as well as with technology that permeates our lives, bearing breakthrough opportunities while raising serious concerns for equity, inclusion and democratic participation (<https://en.unesco.org/futuresofeducation/news/24-january-2022-international-day-education>).

"In these exceptional times, business as usual is no longer an option. If we are to transform the future, if we are to change course, we must rethink education. This means forging a new social contract for education, as called for by the UNESCO report on the Futures of Education, released last November" according to Audrey Azoulay, UNESCO Director General

International Day of Education 2022 aims to generate debate around how to strengthen education as a public endeavour and common good, how to steer the digital transformation, support teachers, safeguard the planet and unlock the potential in every person to contribute to collective well-being and our shared home (<https://sdg.iisd.org/events/international-day-of-education-2022/>)

Objectives: The National Convention aims to:

- Increase understanding and appreciation of education programs which are grounded in human rights and based on principles of non-discrimination, social justice, respect for life, human dignity and cultural diversity, an ethic of care, reciprocity, and solidarity.
- Showcase innovative programs and practices aligned to transforming education grounded in human rights and based on principles of non-discrimination, social justice, respect for life, human dignity and cultural diversity, ethic of care, reciprocity, and solidarity.
- Provide an avenue for the demonstration of modules/classes in values education for transforming education

Program Themes

Developing Critical Thinking Competencies- applying Digital Blooms Taxonomy in teaching and learning, countering misinformation and disinformation, innovative teaching strategies for critical thinking competencies, social media literacy

Digital Pedagogies in teaching Values and Peace education - HyFlex learning, blended learning, online learning, gamification, educational animations, explanatory videos & short documentaries, augmented/virtual reality applications

Digital Citizenship - competencies for global and local digital citizenship, engaging positively, critically and competently in the digital environment, drawing on the skills of effective

communication and creation, practicing forms of social participation that are respectful of human rights and dignity through the responsible use of technology

Cyber-wellness and Safety - enhancing positive well-being among internet users, protecting oneself online, proper internet behavior, preventing cyber bullying

Balangkas ng Nagkakaisang Sambayanan (BANSANG) Department of Education Peace Framework - Best practices of BANSANG projects and programs – DepEd – Dr. Allan

Achieving Sustainable Development Goals through Education - integrating SDGs into classroom and school activities and programs, involving communities for attainment of SDGs

Foundations of Leadership - soft skills of leadership, the person of the leader, self-awareness, discernment skills, technical skills in leading teams, and the values of integrity (commitment to truth), authenticity (commitment to one's values, having a clear personal vision of the best version of oneself) and commitment to something bigger than oneself (sense of service and mission).

The themes revolve around the leading-edge thinking about transforming education, the innovative approaches and practices, and the assessment, monitoring and evaluation; and the gaps where more research and efforts are needed. These topics are situated within the context of APNIEVE's twin thrusts: values education and international education, and APNIEVE's core values of peace, human rights, democracy, gender equity, and sustainable development, in order to achieve inclusive and quality education by 2030.
